#### **Holcim Donation**

For the fifth year in a row, Holcim (formerly Aggregate Industries), a local asphalt, paving and crushed stone supplier, ran a fundraiser and food drive to benefit Table of Plenty and the Chelmsford Food Pantry. Holcim Vice President and General Manager, Bob Andersson, who grew up in Chelmsford, spearheads this effort along with a dedicated team of employees who are committed to giving to our two organizations to help sustain the weekly dinners and food distribution. The Holcim team at the Chelmsford plant ran a food drive at work and collected a truckload of food which they delivered to the Food Pantry.
