In November of 2020, Table of Plenty lost a good friend, John Wadman. One of the seven guests at our inaugural dinner in May of 2010, John went years without missing a single meal with us. He first heard about our free community meal from Board member Debbie Kendrick, a family friend. He would often attend with his niece, but his company was enjoyed by all who sat with him. As his obituary said, he was "A friend to all he met".

Originally from Medford, John played hockey at Dartmouth College and then earned his PhD in Chemistry from Brooklyn Polytech. When John died, his family asked that Table of Plenty be

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the recipient of memorials in his name. This June, a special meal was sponsored in his honor from these donations.

Additionally, Table of Plenty was extremely moved to find out that John included us in his will, leaving a generous gift. His sister, Sue said John so enjoyed the thought of including Table of Plenty in his will, as it was an important part of his life. He looked forward to the delicious meals and the socialization. Sue said that he appreciated the kindness of all who came and all who served, and felt that Table of Plenty graciously provided a service to those in need. She added that he liked to tell his jokes, whether they would good or not! We will remember the smiles he brought to our faces with his "Chicken Crossing the Road" jokes.

We decided to close TOPIC in January and February due to a spike in COVID cases and restrictions at the Senior Center. The crew is now getting used to the new kitchen design and are more comfortable after the brief lay off. They have plenty of space in the walk-in refrigerator and freezer. Many thanks to all the staff at the Senior Center who have been very accommodating with access to the kitchen.

Each week the plan is to cook 120 meals and so far, that seems to be the correct amount. We have had good luck with our traditional meals of hamburg and macaroni, shepherd's pie, and of course meatloaf. Fish was also a big hit recently. As the seasons change so does our menu. With summer upon us we will start changing into lighter meals.

We are always looking for good solid cooks as volunteers! The cooking teams are comprised of some really great people—some with top notch skills and all with a desire to serve a quality meal. Their dedication to TOPIC is amazing. We are very thankful for each and every one of them!
